Objectives	After a yearlong country wide process of sensitization and discussion on the discourses of Development Effective (DE), Principles of Partnership (PoP), Charter 4 Change (C4C) and Grand Bargain (GB) commitment, with civil society participation, this local NGO / CSO conference will be held to <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) to declare a NGO self-accountability charter, (ii) to announce NGO / CSO charter of expectations from government and partners (INGOs and donors) and solicit facilitation support to grow as a sovereign and sustainable sector, (iii) to promote positive engagement, cooperation and coordination across the sector especially with the government, and (iv) to support government plan to achieve sustainable development goals, vision 2021 and 2041

Background	<p>Principles of Partnership (PoP) which was announced during 2007 and signed by around 40 organizations including International Red Cross, INGOs and World Bank after a worldwide discussion. Charter 4 Change (C4C) was also announced during 2015 signed by around 40 globally prominent INGOs, and more than 150 national and local NGOs has signed as endorser. And there was milestone commitment was agreed and announced as Grand Bargain (GB) during World Humanitarian Summit (WHS) May 2016 in Istanbul, Turkey. Almost all major donor countries, UN agencies and INGO networks has signed the GB commitments. Which is the first declarations with measurable 51 indicators under 10 streams primarily towards localization, transparency and participation revolution.</p> <p>Apart from these, there was another global discourse i.e., Aid effectiveness to Development effectiveness, state parties along with UN agencies and multilateral financial institutions like World Bank has been organized this. There was discussion and milestone agreement have had happened especially in Monterrey Consensus (2002), Paris Declaration on Aid Effectiveness (2005), Accra Agenda for Development Effectiveness (2008), Busan Partnership for Effective Development Cooperation (2011) and at the latest in Nairobi Declaration for Development Effectiveness (2016) . One of the major outcome is GPEDC (Global Platform on Effective Development Cooperation), the body to promote cooperation between state, private sectors and the civil societies. Currently Finance Minister, Bangladesh is the co- chair of the GPEDC along with the Finance Minister from Germany and Uganda. The process has accepted the notion of civil society as the equal actor in the process of development. Now a days political sociologists consider state as first, private or market as second and civil society or NGO as the third sector.</p>

	<p>Bangladeshi CSO/NGOs was always proactive in participating to all those discourses. Taking this in continuation during 2016-2019 again there was country wide process of sensitization, where conferences have taken place in 8 divisions and 24 districts, where three specific outcomes have been discussed and specified as (i) how CSO/NGOs will be more accountable, (ii) what and how we expect cooperation from government, development partners (INGOs and donors) and we may expect (iii) how we in our wider sector can have positive engagement, cooperation and coordination with government. This planned conference is a final culmination of presenting those in front of key policy leaders from national and international level and also to pledge how as CSO/NGO will be accountable and to contribute in country's commitment to achieve SDG, vision 2021 and 2041.</p>
<p>Participants with categories</p>	<p>At least 5 NGO / CSO leader from each of the 64 districts based on criteria, especially who are active and with probability to be active on sustainable basis, committed to the pro poor humanitarianism and development, non-partisan, with fair image and with influencing characters, will be selected through bottom up participatory process and will be invited to participate in the conference. District participants 320, small grass root MFI 50 (with their own support), Dhaka based NGO leaders 50, Guest from UN agencies, INGOs and high officials 75, plus 50 conference management volunteers, all total 545.</p>
<p>Principles, approach and methodology of the conference sessions / panels</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) We will follow as much as possible inclusive approach so that all categories of NGO/CSOs are invited and participated. (ii) Panel members and moderators will be selected to cover all the different categories of networks, so that they will be able to participate and to feel ownership on the process and take away the outcome messages. (iii) Translation equipment will be imported and will be utilized for simultaneous translation on English for proper understanding of foreigners. (iv) All the panel members will have highest 60 seconds in each slot deliberations and participants from floor will have 30 seconds in each interventions. There will be such a request, orientation and a leaflet will be given to all the panel members and participants. In conclusion all the panel members will have 60 seconds slot to provide their final comments. In this way we will try to maximize the participation of conference participants and sharing of panel members.
