Time allocation for speaking	<p>We want to provide space for as many speakers as possible, we will therefore have to limit the time and request speakers to not repeat issues already addressed. In each session, there will be two international guests, two panel members, and five / six BDCSO leaders who will be invited to speak. On top of that, there will be at least 8 interventions from the floor.</p> <p>All guests will be requested to take 3 to 4 minutes. Panel members will have 2 minutes and Interventions from floor will be given 90 seconds each. We request not to spend time on address and thank you, even not to duplicate the issues. Background	<p>We are in an era of Grand Bargain and localization. What is emphasized in Grand Bargain 2.0. is transparency, support to local actors, and participation.</p> <p>In view of our local context and history, importance to local level civil society along with the philosophy of our liberation war to promote the culture of democracy and human rights.</p> <p>Bangladesh’s history of the emergence of CSO as a third sector, we need to think that what is shaping is taking place toward the future. We feel there is an organizational and individual activist approach for building a responsive and emphatic society too.</p> <p>BDCSO Process is an informal process to promote localization and greater unity within the sector at least with common minimum position/principles.</p> <p>BDCSO Process has emerged during 2018 amidst countrywide awareness campaign and discourse on the Grand Bargain, Charter 4 Change, and Aid effectiveness to development effectiveness. It was a felt need that there should be an independent process which would support local civil society for the promotion of democracy and human rights. During 2019 we had a face to face conference where we declared the Charter of Accountability and the Charter of Expectations. During 2020 we had a virtual conference. In this year 2021 we are having this virtual conference, to keep up our motivation, link to other national and international actors, and update our knowledge. Methodology	At the very outset of the session, moderator will inform about the format, ground rules and objectives of the session. The chair will be requested to give a 1 minute welcome speech. Then the moderator will invite the special guest, 2/3 panel members and 1/ 2 interventions from floor. The moderator will remind all speakers of their time limit, and not to repeat what has already been said and not to spend time on giving thanks and addressing, they should go straight to the points, so that there will be maximum participation.
