Objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(i) To brief the stakeholders on Global Development Cooperation Conference outcome: from Rome to Kampala.</li> <li>(ii) To brief why and how envisage effective development cooperation, especially the interaction among state, market and civil societies, international development agencies.</li> <li>(iii) To explain indicators of 4MR so that civil society will study and observe on those for giving feedback in this regard later.</li> </ul>

Background	<p>Discourse on cooperation of state, market, and civil society in respect of aid effectiveness initiated during Rome Declaration (2003), the process has been initiated by UN, OECD and World Bank. In each five-year discourse ie being happened, now it has renamed as Development Effectiveness, <a href="http://www.effectivecooperation.org">www.effectivecooperation.org</a> Now a committee leading the process named as GPEDC (Global Process on Effective Development Cooperation), where Minister from Indonesia, Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), Director General of SIDA and a civil society representative leading the process.</p> <p>In Bangladesh DE (Development Effectiveness) Wing of ERD (External Resource Division) of Planning Commission leading the process. COAST Foundation and Coastal Development Partnership is acting as civil society focal in this regard in Bangladesh with the guidance of Asia Focal APRN / Reality of Aid, Philippines.</p> <p>Now five principles are the main essence of effective cooperation, which are (i) country ownership, (ii) focus on results, (iii) inclusive development partnership, (iv) mutual accountability, and (v) leave no one behind. The last one has been drawn in Kampala Principal Assessment declaration (2019).</p> <p>There are round of monitoring the implementation of principles and declaration is being happened with the indicators is being set by the central steering committee. In Bangladesh, 9<sup>th</sup> December 2024 formal kick off meeting of 4 MR has been Chaired by Mr. Md. Shahriar Kader Siddiky, Secretary ERD. COAST Foundation and CDP has been assigned to coordinate the civil society group. After completion of process must be submitted to the DE Wing of ERD by March.</p> <p>We both COAST and CDP feel that the whole process, the Background, and indicators should be elaborated to civil society and its related agencies, especially to the senior officials of NGO Affairs Bureau, Social Welfare Ministry, Women Affairs Ministry, PKSF (<i>Palli Kormo Sahayak</i> Foundation), Microcredit Regulatory Authority and Register of Joint Stock Companies.</p> <p>Considering these COAST Foundation is going to organize this seminar. All high officials from government agencies, NGO CSO and its network leaders will be invited in the seminar. They will be oriented on the issues / indicators. They will be invited for a meeting, where consensus opinions will be developed to finalize</p>
